## What to pack for Summer Camp:

- Scout Handbook (protected in a zipper bag)
- Merit Badge Binder/pens & pencils
- Class A Uniform (will be worn on departure day and return day and various activities during camp)
- Class B Shirts
- Sleeping bag ( they will be sleeping on cots in BSA tents so no bed rolls unless you want them too)
- Mess Kit
- Canteen/ Water bottle
- Eating Utensils
- Flashlight/Headlamp with extra batteries
- 2-3 pairs of clothes \*
- Boots and Tennis Shoes/Extra Socks (Muck boots & Crocs can also be useful) \*NO OPEN TOE SHOES IN CAMP
- Rain Poncho
- Hat
- Jacket
- o Toothbrush
- Deodorant
- Shampoo
- Soap
- Towels (1 for showering, and 1 for swimming)
- Bug Spray
- Sun Block
- Day Pack
- Fishing Rod

- Camp chair
- Water resistant watch
- Swimming Suit
- Rope/cordage to create a clothes line
- A couple of trash bags for wet/dirty clothes
- Money (for lunch and breakfast on their travel days, as well as some extra to use at the camp general store for snacks) \*Camp Liberty states the "average" scout spends \$100 at camp.
- Camp Gift Card info can be found on page 8 of the "Heritage Reservation Guide"
- Camera \*\*(Not Phone)\*\*
- Extras: Deck of cards or small travel game or a book to read
- Medications (Please supply just what your child will need to take while on their camping adventure)
